## Farewell Barthomley WI

Barthomley WI was formed in May 1925 with 89 members. Early meetings were held in Barthomley School. During World War 11 members made jam, bottled fruit, collected rose hips, made meat pies which were so popular as they were in addition to rations. They also knitted for the troops, took in evacuees, sent eggs to the Orthopaedic Hospital at Hartshill, raised funds for the North Staffs Royal Infirmary



and still managed to hold day time meetings( bringing their own ration of tea )

From records it is obvious that Barthomley members were always highly competitive and received many accolades both collectively and individually. The Village Scrapbooks make fascinating reading and are a credit to past members for their endeavours. Achievements at both the Cheshire County Show and Betley Show are outstanding. What talent abounded! Above all the friendship and support developed by the WI have been invaluable. We served the community well and are proud to be one of the oldest WIs in Cheshire. On May 8th 2025 we celebrated our 100th Birthday at Crewe Golf Club; it was a joyous occasion but tinged with sadness as it was also our suspension meeting. Since Covid membership had dropped to 20, no new blood was coming forward and the committee, although keen to continue, just could not give the necessary commitment to keep the WI viable.

This is a sad end to an era. Our President Val Isom has worked so hard, written interesting reports for the Parish News, kept us together but the inevitable has happened. We have reached the end of the road. I am ever hopeful that a new younger generation will come forward and resurrect Barthomley WI.
